

Questions for Your Veterinarian

If your veterinarian prescribes a medication for atopic dermatitis, you may want to ask the following questions:

1. Are there any side effects to watch for?
2. Does the treatment contain steroids?
3. How often should I administer the treatment?
4. How soon will I start seeing results?
5. How effective is the treatment in controlling atopic dermatitis?
6. What are the advantages of this treatment over other options?
7. Do I need to monitor any clinical signs after treatment begins?
8. Has the product been proven safe in dogs?
9. How often do I need to come back for you to monitor my dog?



If you'd like, print this list of questions and bring it with you to your veterinarian. She or he can discuss these and the treatment options with you to determine the product that is right for your dog.

As with all drugs, side effects may occur. In a field study, the most common side effects were gastrointestinal signs. Gingival hyperplasia and papillomas may also occur during the initial dosing phase. ATOPICA (Cyclosporine capsules, USP) is not for use dogs with a history of malignant neoplasia, or with a demonstrated hypersensitivity to Cyclosporine A.
